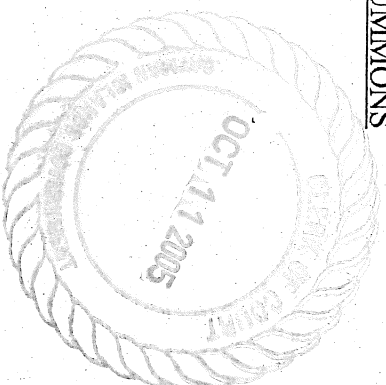

LET THE DEFENDANT, within 14 days after service of this Summons on him, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of Mrs. Dorothy Hydes of P.O. Box 110, Hell Post Office, West Bay, Grand Cayman, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendant an overriding interest in the matrimonial home which is located at property legally known as West Bay North West Block 1D Parcel 72. The Plaintiff hereby seeks the following relief:

1. That the Defendant be restrained forthwith from evicting the Plaintiff from the matrimonial home.
2. That the Defendant be ordered to give the Plaintiff one half share of any sale proceeds of the matrimonial home.
3. Any other relief that this Honourable Court deems just.

Accordingly, the Plaintiff hereby seeks the determination of the Honourable Court on the following points, namely:

1. That the Plaintiff was never divorced from her husband Claude Arch Hydes, the Defendant's father, who is now deceased.
2. That the Defendant took the conveyance of the matrimonial home into her name subject to the Plaintiff's overriding interest as the lawful wife who has a beneficial interest in the matrimonial home

and who was in actual occupation of the matrimonial home at the time of the conveyance to the Defendant.

3. That the Defendant accordingly has held the matrimonial home since the conveyance subject to a half share of the matrimonial home belonging to the Plaintiff, who was the lawful wife of Claude Arch Hydes at the time of the conveyance to the Defendant. Accordingly, at the time of the conveyance the Plaintiff had a beneficial interest in the matrimonial home and also was in actual occupation of the matrimonial home. The Plaintiff relies on s.28(g) of The Registered Land Law (2004 Revision).

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
