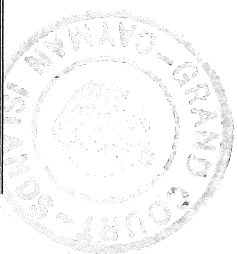

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495 GT, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.



STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is and was at all material times a Strata Corporation formed pursuant to the *Strata Titles Registration Law (1973 Revision)* and amendments thereto and having an address for delivery in care of its attorneys of PO Box 190 GT, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands. It is also known as Silver Oaks.
2. The Defendants are individuals residing at Apartment #22 Silver Oaks, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, both with a mailing address of PO Box 415 WB, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands. The Defendants are joint proprietors of Block 20D Parcel 408H25 and known locally as Apartment #22, Silver Oaks.
3. The Plaintiff relies on the *Strata Titles Registration Law (1996 Revision)* (the “**Strata Law**”) and the Registered by-laws of the Proprietors of Strata Plan No. 159 (the “**Strata By-Laws**”).
4. Pursuant to the Strata Law and the Strata By-Laws, the Plaintiff is entitled to assess and collect administrative fees from the proprietors for common expenses and incidental expenses such as insurance, repairs to damaged property and general upkeep of the strata lots and common property.
5. Pursuant to paragraph 5 (3) (a) on page 7 of the Strata By-Laws, unpaid assessments accrue interest at the rate of 4% per annum above the thirty day London Inter Bank Offer Rate for the United States Dollar at the time of default with a minimum of 12% per annum.
6. The Plaintiff did assess common expenses and rendered invoices of such assessments on the Defendants from time to time contemporaneous with the assessments.
7. Notwithstanding the rendering of invoices for assessments, from time to time, and a demand for payment made prior to the commencement of these proceedings, the Defendants have either failed or neglected to pay assessed common expenses, strata fees and insurance deductibles, in the amount of CI\$11,225.22, inclusive of interest, as of 30 September 2005.
8. As a result of the above, the Plaintiff is entitled to the relief claimed in this proceeding.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- (a) CI\$11,225.22 being the total sum of the expenses owing and interest as at 30 September 2005;
- (b) Pre and post judgment interest at the rate of 12% (4% above thirty day London Inter Bank Offer Rate for the United States dollar, which is 3.5% as at the date of issuing this proceeding with 12% per annum minimum amount of interest) pursuant to paragraph 5 (3) (a) on page 7 of the Strata By-Laws;
- (c) Alternatively, pre and post-judgment interest in accordance with the *Judicature Law (2002 Revision)* and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time;
- (d) Costs on an indemnity basis or standard basis in accordance with the Court Costs Rules 2001;
- (e) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just.

INDORSEMENT

The principal amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$1,225.22 inclusive of interest as of the date of filing. The amount of the filing fees to commence the proceeding is US\$182.93 (CI\$150.00). If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the defendant pays the plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal, interest and the costs of issuing the Writ of Summons and Statement of Claim, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the plaintiff or to its attorneys-at-law.

INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

1. The contractual term upon which interest is claimed is as set out in paragraph 5 above;
2. The prescribed rate of interest is 12% (4% above thirty day London Inter Bank Offer Rate for the United States dollar, which is 3.5% as at the date of issuing this proceeding with 12% per annum minimum amount of interest) per annum;
3. The date from which interest is payable is 19 October 2005;
4. The total interest claimed as at 18 October 2005 is nil; and
5. The amount of interest accruing due each day is CI\$3.69.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.
After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495 GT, Grand Cayman.
2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).
If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.
If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.
If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.
3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
