STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is and was at all material times the owner of property being Registration Section Lower Valley Block 32B Parcel 159 situate in Savannah, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands, B.W.I.
2. The Defendant was at all material times the common-law husband of the Plaintiff and the father of two of her three children.
3. On a date in May 1996, which the Plaintiff cannot specifically recall, and after having him previously removed from the said property, the Defendant wrongfully re-entered the said premises and, notwithstanding repeated requests by or on behalf of the Plaintiff for him to vacate the same, he has wrongfully refused to do so.
4. The Defendant threatens and intends, unless restrained by an Order of this Honourable Court, to continue to remain in wrongful occupation of the said property and premises thereon and to continue his trespass thereon.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. An injunction to restrain the Defendant from remaining on or continuing in occupation of the said property and premises thereon;
2. Damages;
3. Costs;
4. Further and other relief.
