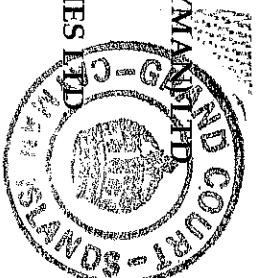

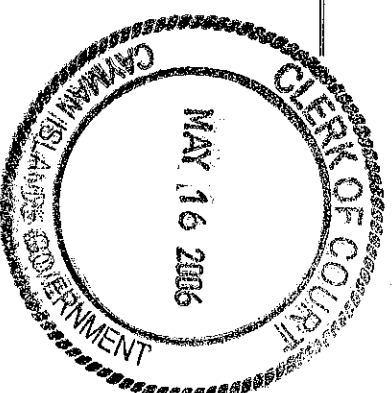

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within Fourteen days [14] after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM


1. Plaintiff ("the Bank") is a Class "A" Bank licenced to carry on commercial banking business within the Cayman Islands.
2. The Defendant is a company registered under the Companies Law of the Cayman Islands.
3. The Defendant was at all relevant times a customer of the Bank.
4. The Defendant is indebted to the Bank in the sum of US\$45,156.14 being money owing to the Bank by way of a credit card facility granted to the Defendant on or about 14 September 2000 together with interest in accordance with the terms of the credit card agreement ("the Agreement").
5. Under the terms of the Agreement the Defendant agreed to make minimum payments each month as advised by the Bank in the statements issued by the Bank to the Defendant, failing which the entire balance due is payable upon demand.
6. It was also a term and condition of the Agreement that interest would accrue on outstanding balances at the rate of 18 percent per annum, calculated monthly in arrears. Under the terms and conditions of the Agreement, or alternatively, by virtue of the universal custom between banker and customer, the Bank is entitled to compound any unpaid interest at the end of each month into principal.
7. Despite demand by the Bank, there remains a balance outstanding on the Defendant's account in the amount of US\$45,156.14 as at 11 May 2006 with interest accruing on the outstanding balance at the rate of 18% per annum or US\$22.27 per day.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

- (a) The sum of US\$45,156.14;
- (b) Interest on the sum of US\$45,156.14 at the rate of 18% per annum compounded monthly from 11 May 2006 to the date of judgment or sooner payment with the current rate of accrual being US\$22.27 per day;
- (c) The Plaintiff claims further interest on the sum US\$45,156.14 at the rate of 18% per annum or US\$22.27 per day from the date of judgment until settlement of the judgment.
- (d) Alternatively, the Plaintiff claims interest on the said sum of US\$45,156.14 pursuant to Section 34 of the Judicature Law (2004 Revision) at the rate of 3% per annum or at such other rate as may be prescribed under the said Law from the date hereof to the date of judgment or sooner payment.
- (e) Costs to be taxed or alternatively fixed costs in the sum of CI\$920.28 (US\$1,122.29).

If within the time for returning Acknowledgement of Service the Defendant pays to the Plaintiff's Attorneys-at-Law the total amount claimed of US\$45,156.14 together with interest and costs of CI\$920.28 (US\$1,122.29) all further proceedings will be stayed.
