

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to it as the Court may think just and expedient.

2) An order that the Plaintiff be awarded its costs of this Summons such costs to be added to the principal money secured by the Charge.

1) An order pursuant to section 67(c) of the Registered Land Law (2004 Revision) and/or clause 2(a) of the Schedule to the Charge dated 28 October 1997 granted by the Defendant in favour of the Plaintiff (formerly known as Barclays Bank Plc) as varied on 1 April 1998 and 8 February 2001 ("the Charge") that the Plaintiff as chargee and/or its agents be entitled to enter upon and examine the state and condition of the charged property registered and known as Block 53A, Parcel 47, North Side ("the Property").

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of FirstCaribbean International Bank (Cayman) Limited, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendant for the following relief:

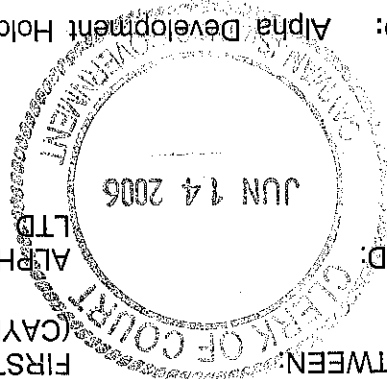

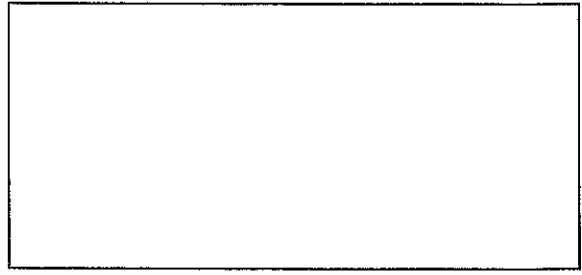

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.

2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.

3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.

4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)";

5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.

6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.

7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.

8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
