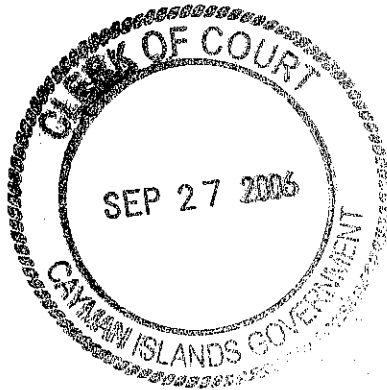

**ORIGINATING SUMMONS**


LET THE DEFENDANT of P.O. Box 1234 GT, Queensgate House, South Church Street, George Town, Grand Cayman, attend before the Judge in Chambers at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman, on the 6<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2006, at 9:30 o'clock on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiffs of P.O. Box 100, Sydney Vane House, Admiral Park, St. Peter Port, Guernsey, GY1 3EL, for Orders that:

1. The voluntary winding up and dissolution of the Defendant which occurred by virtue of the provisions of the Memorandum and Articles of Association of the Defendant be stayed pursuant to section 103 and section 141 of the Companies Law (2004 Revision);
2. All dispositions of the property, effects and things in action of the Defendant and every transfer of shares, or alteration in the status of the members of the Defendant made since the commencement of the voluntary winding up are valid;
3. The Liquidators of the Defendant do vacate office forthwith;

4. The time for acknowledgement of service of this Summons be abridged as appropriate; and
5. There be no order as to costs.

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days after service of this Summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

**Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.
