

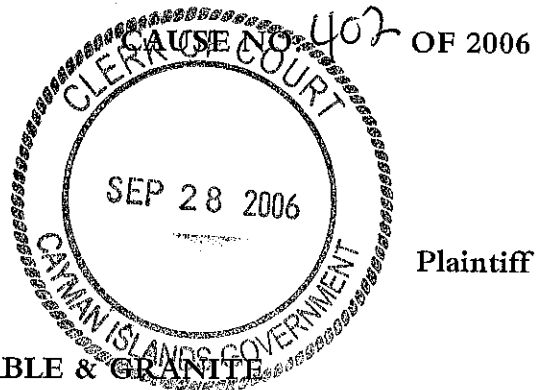

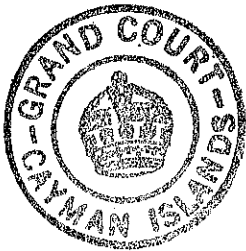

WRIT OF SUMMONS

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 22nd of September 2006

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is a company incorporated pursuant to the laws of the Cayman Islands and at all material times provided Fire and Catastrophe, Public Liability and Burglary insurance coverage to the Defendants. The Plaintiff's registered office is PO Box 10056, Grand Cayman, KY1-1001. The Plaintiff's address for service is in care of its attorneys Appleby Hunter Bailhache.

2. The First Defendant, Mike Laurenson, is and was at all material times an individual who trades and carries on business under the name Elite Marble & Granite. The First Defendant's address for service is PO Box 10283, Grand Cayman, KY1-1003, Cayman Islands.

3. The Second Defendant, Lee Webb, is and was at all material times an individual who trades and carries on business under the name Elite Marble & Granite. The Second Defendant's address for service is PO Box 10283, Grand Cayman, KY1-1003, Cayman Islands.

4. The First and Second Defendants (the "**Defendants**") at all material times were holders of a Fire and Catastrophe insurance policy (the "**Fire Policy**"), a Public Liability insurance policy (the "**Public Liability Policy**") and a Burglary insurance policy (the "**Burglary Policy**") (collectively the "**Policies**").

Fire Policy

5. On or about 11 March 2005, the Plaintiff and the Defendants entered into an agreement whereby, *inter alia*, the Plaintiff would provide fire and catastrophe insurance for the Defendants' property located at Units #19 and #20, Universal Warehouse Park, Barnes Drive, Industrial Park, George Town, Grand Cayman and the Defendants would pay all premiums for such insurance coverage.

6. The premium for the Fire Policy was CI\$7,355.00. The Defendant made one payment of CI\$5,042.00 towards the premium of the Fire Policy.

Public Liability Policy

7. On or about 11 March 2005, the Plaintiff and the Defendants entered into an agreement whereby, *inter alia*, the Plaintiff would provide public liability insurance for anywhere the Defendants may operate and the Defendants would pay all premiums for such insurance coverage.
8. The premium for the Public Liability Policy was CI\$5,005.00.

Burglary Policy

9. On or about 11 March 2005, the Plaintiff and the Defendants entered into an agreement whereby, *inter alia*, the Plaintiff would provide burglary insurance for the Defendants' property located at Units #19 and #20, Universal Warehouse Park, Barnes Drive, Industrial Park, George Town, Grand Cayman and the Defendants would pay all premiums for such insurance coverage.
10. The premium for the Burglary Policy was CI\$2,756.00.
11. The Plaintiff did provide such insurance coverage in accordance with the agreements for the full year of 11 March 2005 to 10 March 2006 after which time the Policies lapsed.
12. The Defendants failed to pay all premiums as due and as of the date of commencement of this proceeding the Defendants owe to the Plaintiff all unpaid premiums in the amount of CI\$10,074.00 plus interest and costs.
13. The Defendants were sent reminder statements requesting payment and were sent letters demanding payment of the unpaid premiums in the amount of CI\$10,074.00. The Defendants have failed or neglected to make any payments towards the unpaid premiums.

14. The Plaintiff claims interest at the rate as set by and in accordance with the *Judicature Law (2004 Revision)* and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules from the date of the unpaid premiums, namely from 11 March 2005.
15. As a result of the default of the payments the Plaintiff is entitled to judgment against the Defendants in the amount of CI\$10,074.00 plus interest and costs.

AND THE PLAINTIFF claims:

- a) CI\$10,074.00 for unpaid insurance policy premiums;
- b) CI\$563.04 Pre-judgment interest calculated in accordance with the *Judicature Law (2004 Revision)* and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules from 11 March 2005 to the date of commencement of this proceeding, namely 22 September 2006;
- c) Pre and post judgment interest in accordance with the *Judicature Law (2004 Revision)* and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time;
- d) Costs on an indemnity basis or standard basis in accordance with the Court Costs Rules 2001; and
- e) Such further and other relief as this Court may deem just.

INDORSEMENT

The principal amount claimed in respect of the debt is CI\$10,074.00 plus interest of CI\$563.04 as of 22 September 2006. The amount of the filing fees to commence the proceeding is CI\$200.00. If, within the time for returning the acknowledgement of service, the defendants pay the plaintiff or its attorneys-at-law the total amount claimed in principal, interest and the costs of issuing the Writ of Summons, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the plaintiff or to its attorneys-at-law.

INDORSEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

1. The term upon which interest is claimed is in accordance with the *Judicature Law (2004 Revision)* and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules as amended from time to time;
2. The prescribed rate of interest at the relevant times in accordance with the *Judicature Law (2004 Revision)* and the Judgment Debt (Rates of Interest) Rules is 3% per annum for the period 11 March 2005 to 30 June 2006 and 7¼% per annum for the period 1 July 2006 to 22 September 2006;
3. The date from which interest is payable is 11 March 2005;
4. The total interest claimed as at 22 September 2006 is CI\$563.04; and
5. The amount of interest accruing due each day is CI\$2.00.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of each Defendant or by each Defendant if acting in person.

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495, Grand Cayman, KY1-1106.

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant.

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by instalments or otherwise.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
