By this Summons, issued on the applicant of DENNIS McNEIL BROWN of No. 47 Middle Road, George Town, Grand Cayman, the Plaintiff claim against the Defendant for guardianship, custody, care and control of their minor child DENNIS McNEIL BROWN under section 7 of the Guardianship and Custody of Children Law 1996 (revised) AND for the following orders to be made;

1. That the Plaintiff be granted sole guardianship, custody, care and control of the minor child DEZAHRIA TEHYRAH BROWN.
2. That the Defendant be restrained whether by herself, her servants and /or agents from removing or attempting to remove DEZAHRIA TEHYRAH BROWN from the care and control of the Plaintiff or from the jurisdiction without the express written consent of the Plaintiff.

3. That the Defendant be granted defined access to the minor child.
4. That the Defendant do pay to the Plaintiff a reasonable sum per week for the maintenance of the said child.
5. That the Defendant equally contribute towards the educational expenses of the said minor child.
6. Such further or other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

If the Defendant does acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledgement of service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is used as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
