

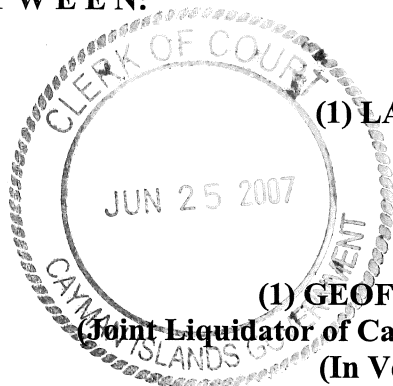

LET THE DEFENDANTS within 14 days after service of this Summons on them, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office, P O Box 495G, George Town Grand Cayman.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of the Plaintiff, Lane P. Pendleton of 261 Tanglin Road Singapore the Plaintiff claims against the Defendants as follows:

- 1 A declaration that the Plaintiff has not proved in the liquidation of Cairnwood Global Technology Fund Ltd.
- 2 A declaration that the purported rejection by the Defendants of the Plaintiff's claim to an indemnity, as set out in the letter of the Defendants' attorneys, Maples and Calder, dated 1st June 2007, is accordingly of no effect.
- 3 Alternatively, and without prejudice to 1 and 2 above, an Order that the decision of the Defendants rejecting the Plaintiff's proofs of debt be reversed, and the proof of debt admitted in full.
- 4 An Order that the Defendants pay the costs of and incidental to this Summons.

If the Defendants do not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to them as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the named stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
5. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

Notes on address for service

In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.
