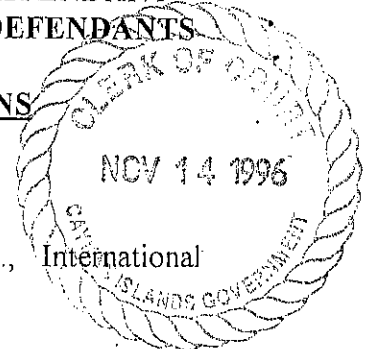

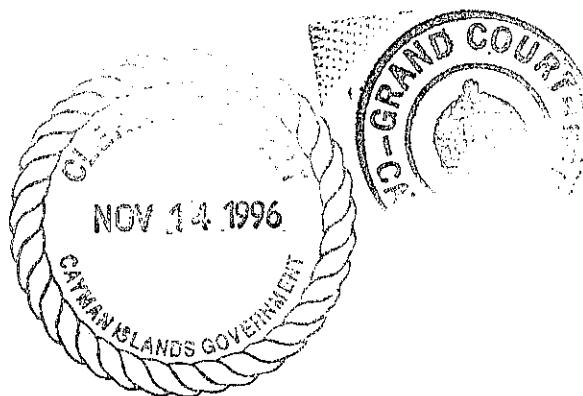

Ref: Everton PARKER

In response to your CA/PI/EP/40 dated 27 Mar 1996; Mr Parker was seen in the Casualty Dept on the 24 Dec 1995 at approx 10.40 am. He stated that he had been involved in a road traffic accident in which his car seat had come adrift from it's mountings. He said he was unrestrained.


His only complaint was of generalised shoulder and neck pain and stiffness. He denied loss of consciousness. On examination, he had tenderness of the left trapezius and interscapular muscles. Otherwise there was no focal neurological signs; chest, abdomen; and limb examination were normal.

X-rays of the skull, chest and pelvis were normal. The initial X-ray of the cervical spine suggested a possible facet joint injury at the C6/7 level. Mr Parker was admitted for observation and the intention to perform further X-rays of the cervical spine. During that period of observation, Mr Parker developed a transient abnormal extensor plantar reflex response. There was no sensory loss or other unusual reflex responses nor any other focal neurological signs. Nevertheless, on the basis of this finding a diagnosis of spinal cord concussion - at the cervical level - was made.

On the 25th Dec, further flexion and extension views of the cervical spine revealed no evidence of instability. There was no recurrence of the abnormal reflexes or any other sequelae on examination. He was discharged home to rest in a cervical collar with analgesia and muscle relaxants.

He was scheduled for review two weeks later but there is no record of his attendance.

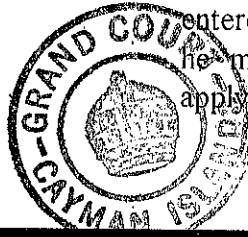
