

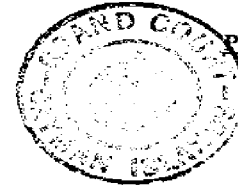

Within 14 days (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, such other period as is specified in the attached Acknowledgement of Service of Writ of Summons) after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, PO Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the

Plaintiffs may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

- 1 Damages; and
- 2 Declarations, *inter alia*, in relation to the status of RSM Cayman Islands (a partnership), including that, the partnership has been dissolved, and/or that the partnership agreement between the Second Plaintiff and the Second Defendant has been discharged, and/or as to the Plaintiffs' entitlement to remuneration and/or as to the status, terms and effect of the Plaintiffs' contractual arrangements with the Defendants (or any of them), either as partners or employees, including that such contracts have been discharged and/or that the Plaintiffs are not subject to any enforceable restraints of trade.

AND THE PLAINTIFFS CLAIM

- (1) Declaratory Relief as summarised aforesaid and as more particularly described in the detailed Statement of Claim;
- (2) Damages or an inquiry thereto;
- (3) Interest pursuant to s.34 of the Judicature Law for such period as the Court thinks fit;

(4) Further and other relief as the Court deems fit;

(5) Costs.
