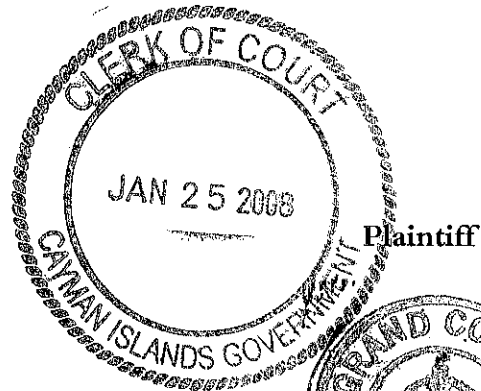

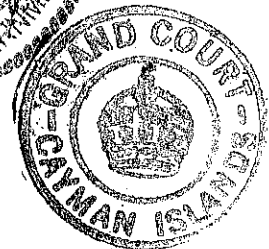


LET THE DEFENDANT, within 14 days after service of this Summons on it, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts office, P.O. Box 495, KY1-1106, George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this Summons, which is issued on the application of Joel Gonzalez of P.O. Box 156 WB, Cayman Islands, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendant for the following relief:

1. That the decision of the Defendant communicated by letter dated 7 January 2008 rejecting in part of the proof of debt of the Plaintiff in these matters, be set aside, and that the said proof of debt be ordered to be admitted in full;
2. Such further or other relief as this Court deems appropriate; and,
3. An Order that the Defendant pay the Plaintiff's costs of this proceeding.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495 GT, George Town, Grand Cayman KY1-1104.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the Originating Summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the Acknowledgment of Service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on

behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.

8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
