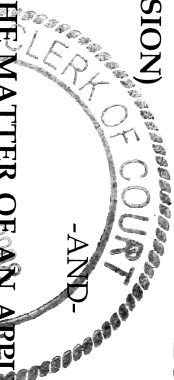

LET THE DEFENDANTS, PHILIP IRA HYDES and ABBEY NATARA GLASGOW of #12  
Constantine Street, Off Grant Street, Frank Sound, Grand Cayman, KY1-1107, Cayman Islands within  
fourteen (14) days after service of this Summons upon them, counting the day of service, return the  
accompanying Acknowledgement of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495, Grand Cayman KY1-  
1106, Cayman Islands.

By this Summons the Plaintiff seeks the following Orders:

1. That this Honourable Court sanctions the variations of the provisions of the Registered Land Law (2004 Revision) contained in First Legal Charge registered on 3 May 2002 against property described in the Cayman Islands Land Register as Registration Section Midland East Block 59B Parcel 58 and in the Second Legal Charge registered on 12 August 2002 against Registration Section Midland East Block 59B Parcel 58, so as to entitle the Bank to rely on the provisions of the said Charges.
2. That the Bank, in the exercise of the powers of sale under the said Charges, is at liberty to sell by public auction or by private treaty the property described in the Cayman Islands Land Register as Registration Section Midland East Block 59B Parcel 58.
3. That this Honourable Court gives such directions as to the reserve price in respect of the property or on other conditions of the sale as it deems appropriate.
4. Costs of this application be awarded to the Plaintiff on an indemnity basis and to be paid out of the proceeds of the sale of the charged properties.
5. There be liberty to apply.

If the Defendants do not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to them as the Court thinks just and expedient.

**NOTES**

- (1) This Summons may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months ) beginning with the above date unless renewed by order of the Court.
- (2) If a defendant does not attend personally or by his attorney at the time and place of the hearing of the Originating Summons, such order will be made as the Court may think just and expedient.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE  
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman

*Notes for Guidance*

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.

**Notes on address for service:**

*Attorneys: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.*

*Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.*
