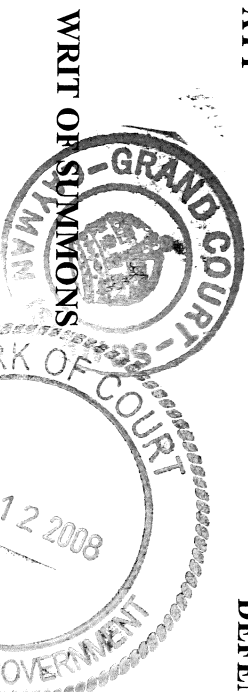

**THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS** has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

Issued this 11<sup>th</sup> day of February 2008.

**NOTE** - This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

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## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

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1. The Plaintiff is a Cayman Island Class "A" Licensed bank ("the Bank"), duly authorized under the laws of the Cayman Islands to, *inter alia*, offer retail facilities to its customers. The Defendant was at all material times a resident of the Cayman Islands, and a customer of the Bank.
2. On 19 February 2004, the Defendant signed a promissory note for a loan of CI\$26,800.00, where the Defendant, on demand, promised to pay the Bank the sum of CI\$26,800.00, together with interest at a rate equal to the Bank's prime interest rate per annum in effect from time to time, plus 1% per annum, before and after judgment, plus the Bank's charges and expenses with respect to the outstanding sum ("the Loan").
3. The Loan was serviced by the Defendant's current account (Account No. 3310765) ("the Account").
4. On 3 January 2008, the outstanding amount under the Loan totaled CI\$22,168.19, plus interest of CI\$445.20 and late fees of CI\$800.00. On 3 January 2008, the Defendant was in default of payment under the terms of his Loan by 157 days, with outstanding arrears totaling CI\$3,168.43.
5. By its attorney's letter, dated 7 January 2008, the Bank made formal notice and demand for the immediate payment of the outstanding arrears of CI\$3,168.43 and formal demand for the immediate payment of the total sum of CI\$22,168.19, plus interest and late charges.
6. Despite acknowledging the debt and acknowledging service of the Bank's attorney's letter of demand on 7 January 2008, the Defendant has failed, refused and/or neglected to pay the amount due to the Bank in respect of the Loan.
7. The Bank is therefore entitled to and claims interest on the Defendant's Loan.

## STATEMENT REGARDING INTEREST

### 7.1. Defendant's interest calculations:

- (i) Interest is calculated on the Loan at a rate equal to the Bank's prime interest rate, plus 1% per annum, before and after judgment.
- (ii) As at 3 January 2008, total interest accrued amounts to CI\$445.20.
- (iii) Interest continues to accrue at the daily rate of CI\$7.05 until payment.

## AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:

1. The sum of CI\$23,413.39;
2. Interest from 3 January 2008 accruing thereafter at the daily rate of CI\$7.05 until payment;
3. Costs; and
4. Such further and/or other relief as this Honourable Court deems appropriate.

If within the time for returning the acknowledgment of service the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$23,413.39, plus interest and costs further proceedings will be stayed. The funds must be paid to the Plaintiff, or its attorney.

**Notes on address for service**

Attorney: Where the Defendant is represented by an Attorney, state the Attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign Attorney.

Defendant in person: Where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered office.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE**

**OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

## NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
