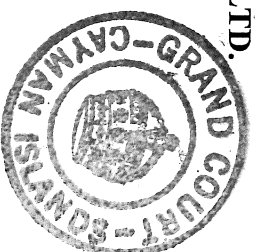
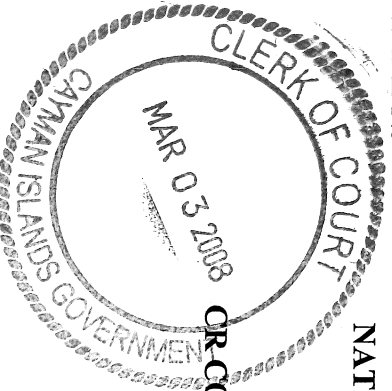

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within 14 days after service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court office, PO Box 495 GT George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating therein whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

ISSUED this 3rd Day of March 2008.

NOTE – this Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is an incorporated company doing business as a cement producer and distributor, with an address for service at P.O. Box 866, Georgetown, Grand Cayman, KY1-1103.
2. The Defendant, CR Construction Ltd is, to the best of the Plaintiff's knowledge an incorporated company with a mailing address of P.O. Box 1226, Georgetown, Grand Cayman ("CR Construction").
3. The Defendants, Leon Bowen and Ray Bowen (collectively, the "Bowens") are businessmen whose residence address is unknown to the Plaintiff, and are, jointly and severally, guarantors of CR Construction under certain agreements made between CR Construction and the Plaintiff.
4. To the best of the Plaintiff's knowledge, at all material times, either or both of the Bowens were directors, officers and/or the directing mind(s) of CR Construction.
5. On and after September 20, 2000, the Defendants entered a series of agreements with the Plaintiff, with some of those agreements being in writing, some being partly oral, and some being made by conduct and/or as a result of a course of dealing between the Plaintiff and the Defendants, particulars of which are set out below.
6. On or about September 20, 2000, the Plaintiff and the Defendants entered the first of these agreements, whereby the Plaintiff would extend general credit to the Defendants for the purchase and delivery of liquid cement to various locations in the future, and in consideration, the Defendants would pay the amounts demanded by the Plaintiff in invoices sent to the Defendants (the "Credit Agreement").
7. It was a term of the Credit Agreement that the Bowens, jointly and severally, personally guaranteed to pay the Plaintiff all accounts, charges, obligations and debts incurred by CR Construction.

8. It was a further term of the Credit Agreement that the Defendants would pay the monies invoiced within 10 days of the date of the invoices, and if those monies were unpaid after 10 days, the Defendants would pay a service charge of 1.5% of the invoice balance each month.
9. On or about May 6, 2006, the Defendants and the Plaintiff entered an agreement which was partly oral and partly by course of conduct between the parties. That agreement was for the provision of cement products and services from the Plaintiff, which totalled C1\$17,709.50. On or around May 6, 2006, the Plaintiff sent the Defendants an invoice numbered 0027882-IN, in respect of this amount.
10. On or about May 13, 2006, the Defendants and the Plaintiff entered an agreement which was partly oral and partly by course of conduct between the parties. That agreement was for the provision of cement products and services from the Plaintiff, which totalled C1\$4,671.00. On or around May 13, 2006, the Plaintiff sent the Defendants an invoice numbered 0027955-IN, in respect of this amount.
11. On or about June 25, 2006, the Defendants and the Plaintiff entered an agreement which was partly oral and partly by course of conduct between the parties. That agreement was for the provision of cement products and services from the Plaintiff, which totalled C1\$15,655.00. On or around June 25, 2006, the Plaintiff sent the Defendants an invoice numbered 0028366-IN, in respect of this amount.
12. On or about August 4, 2006, the Defendants and the Plaintiff entered an agreement which was partly oral and partly by course of conduct between the parties. That agreement was for the provision of cement products and services from the Plaintiff, which totalled C1\$4,342. On or around August 4, 2006, the Plaintiff sent the Defendants an invoice numbered 0028849-IN, in respect of this amount.
13. In so far as these agreements were made partly by conduct, the conduct consisted of, or is to be inferred by the following:

- a. At all material times, the Defendants knew that the Plaintiff used a standard form printed invoice to confirm the delivery of, and indebtedness resulting from an oral order for cement products and services;
- b. At all material times, the Defendants knew that the Credit Agreement applied to any subsequent oral agreements or agreements made by a course of dealing.

14. On or around May 29, 2006, CR Construction paid C1\$1,253.50 towards the total outstanding amounts from invoice 0027882-IN.

15. On or around September 7, 2007, CR Construction paid C1\$1,000 towards the total outstanding amounts from invoices 0027882-IN.

16. On or around August 7, 2007, CR Construction paid C1\$15,000 towards the total outstanding amounts from invoices 0027882-IN.

17. On or around August 1, 2006, CR Construction paid C1\$3,710 towards the total outstanding amounts from invoices 0027955-IN.

18. On or around August 2, 2006, CR Construction paid C1\$600 towards the total outstanding amounts from invoices 0027955-IN.

AND THE PLAINTIFF CLAIMS:-

(i) C1\$20,814. in respect of amounts unpaid;

(ii) C1\$2,677.32 in respect of interest owing to February 16, 2008 on Invoice 0027882-IN;

(iii) C1\$243.12 in respect of interest owing to February 23, 2008 on Invoice 0027955-IN;

- (iv) CI\$4,696.60 in respect of interest owing to February 25, 2008 on Invoice 0028366-IN;
- (v) CI\$1,237.47 in respect of interest owing to March 4, 2008 on Invoice 0028849-IN;
- (vi) Interest pursuant to the *Judicature Law (2004 Revision)*;
- (vii) Costs, disbursements and all legal expenses on a solicitor/own client basis, pursuant to the Credit Agreement;
- (viii) Such further and other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgement of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$29,667.91, plus interest, costs and disbursements, further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or his Attorney.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the named stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
5. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
