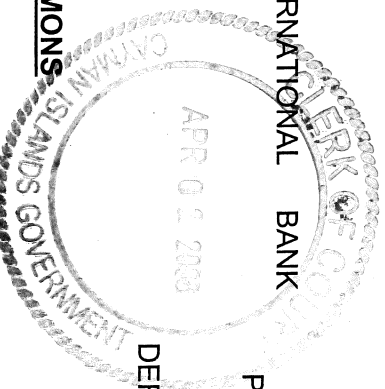

**ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

LET THE DEFENDANT attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George  
Town, Grand Cayman on the                      day of                      2008, at                      o'clock on  
the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff for orders that:

1. This Honourable Court sanction the variation/addition of section 75 of the Registered Land Law (2004 Revision) thereby permitting the Plaintiff to rely upon the terms of the charge executed by the Defendant in favour of the Plaintiff dated 18 May 2000 and registered in the Land Registry on 29 September 2000 ("the Charge") over the property registered as Prospect, Block 22D, Parcel 293H6 ("the Property") including the power contained in clause 19 (c) being the power to sell by private treaty.
2. The Plaintiff be permitted to foreclose or enter into possession of the Property in accordance with the power contained in clauses 19 (b) of the Charge.
3. That the Property be listed for sale at CI\$ 187,500.00.
4. That a confidential reserve price of CI\$ 187,500.00 be fixed in respect of the sale of the Property.

5. The Plaintiff be awarded its costs of this application from the proceeds of sale of the Property.
6. There be liberty to vary this Order by reducing the reserve price for the Property.

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within 14 days after service of this summons on him counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service form to the Courts Office, PO Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes on address for service

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered principal office.

## **DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, PO Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

### **Notes for Guidance**

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.

8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.

9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
