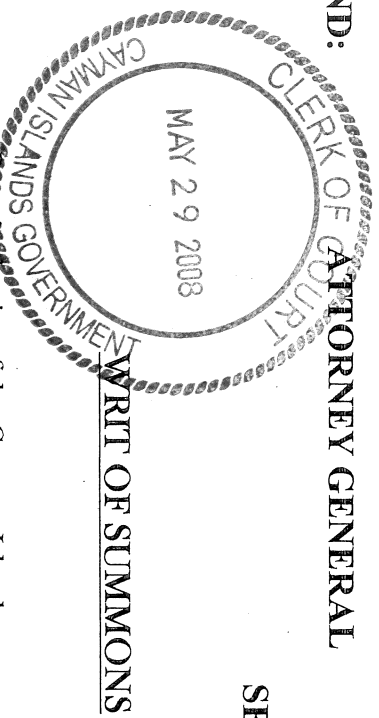

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the Acknowledgment within the time stated, or if you return the Acknowledgment without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

INDORSMENT OF WRIT

THE PLAINTIFF'S CLAIM IS:

- (a) As an employee of the Customs Department of the Cayman Islands Government who was on duty at the premises of the Port Authority of the Cayman Islands on the relevant date for damages for negligence on the part of the Second Defendant as employer to ensure that the premises known as the Cargo Distribution Center located off Portland Rd., George Town, Grand Cayman and registered as George Town East Block 20B, Parcel 379 (hereinafter referred to as 'the premises') where the Plaintiff worked for failing to take reasonable care to make the premises as safe as reasonable care and skill could have made them.
- (b) For damages for personal injury and consequential loss and/or damages suffered by the said Mia Powell on the 30th day of May, 2005 when whilst at work she slipped and fell on steps at the Cargo Distribution Centre.
- (c) In the alternative for damages for breach of statutory duty imposed on the 2nd Defendant by ss.56 & 58 of the Labour Law (2001) Revision in failing to ensure so far as is reasonably practicable the health, safety and welfare at the workplace of its employee, the said Mia Powell.
- (d) As a user of the premises as an employee of the Customs Department which had offices on the premises for damages for negligence on the part of the 1st Defendant as owner and occupier of the premises known as the Cargo Distribution Center located off Portland Rd., George Town, Grand Cayman and registered as George Town East Block 20B, Parcel 379 (hereinafter referred to as 'the premises') for failing to take reasonable care to make the premises as safe as reasonable care and skill could have made them.
- (e) For the cost of this action.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICE

IF YOU INTEND TO INSTRUCT AN ATTORNEY TO ACT FOR YOU GIVE HIM THIS FORM IMMEDIATELY

1. The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person.
2. After completion it must be signed by the Defendant and his attorney (if any) and must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495 G.T., George Town, Grand Cayman.
3. The Acknowledgment of Service must be filed at court and served on the attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person) within fourteen days service of the Writ of Summons.
4. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings must also serve an Answer on the attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person within fourteen days after service of the Writ of Summons.
5. In case of Writ of Summons is served outside the Cayman Islands the periods within which the Respondent must file an Acknowledgment of Service and any Answer are extended by fourteen days.


Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent.

Indorsement by the Plaintiff's attorney (or by the Plaintiff if suing in person) of his name and address in the box below.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by a him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words “ sued as (the name stated on the Writ of Summons)”.
4. Where the defendant is a firm and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “ Partner in the firm of (.....) after his name.
5. Where the defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description “ trading as (.....) after his name.
6. Where the defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the company, but the company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
7. Where the defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an attorney acting for a *guardian ad litem*.
8. A defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
