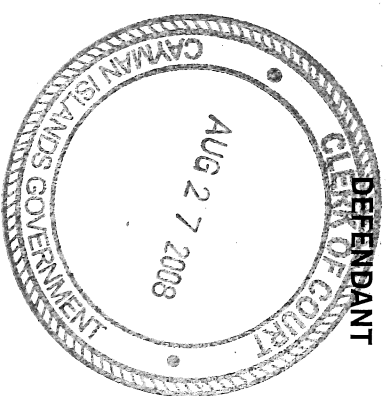

LET THE DEFENDANT, within 14 days after service of this Summons on him, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.

By this Originating Summons, which is issued on the application of Fernando Aranguren Alvarez of Eugenio Cuzin 1085, Parque Industrial Belenes Norte C.P. 45150 Zapopan, Jalisco, Mexico, the Plaintiff herein, claims as against the Defendant the following orders:

- i) **THAT** MIJFA Ltd. (the "Company") Registration No. 404566, be restored to the Register of Companies upon payment of fees and penalty as advised by the Registrar of Companies;
- ii) **THAT** upon the restoration of the Company, CARD Corporate Services Ltd. be appointed as the registered office provider for the Company;

- iii) **THAT** the shares of the Company be restored and that such further or consequential order as is necessary be made; further and/or in the alternative, that immediately upon the restoration of the Company to the Register of Companies, the Plaintiff convene a meeting for the purpose of appointing directors and for passing such resolutions as are necessary for shares of the Company to be registered.
- iv) Such further or other order as is deemed reasonable in the circumstances.

If the Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court think just and expedient.

OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgement of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, Grand Cayman KY1-1106, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgement of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....) after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....) after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.


Notes on address for service
