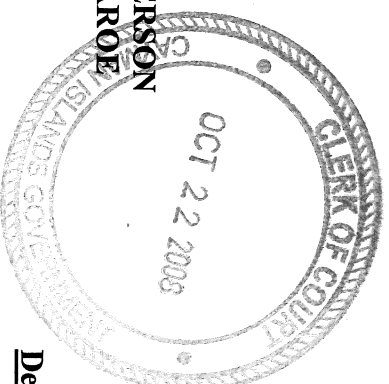
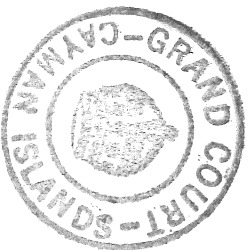

ORIGINATING SUMMONS

TO: STEVEN HENDERSON of PO Box 30496 SMB, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands

AND

TO: LAURENCE CAROE of P.O. Box 257, Town Centre Building, Town Centre,
Providenciales, Turks & Caicos Islands

LET THE DEFENDANTS, within 14 days after service of this Summons on them, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgments of Service to the Courts Office, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman.


By this Summons, which is issued on the application of DR. JACK TSE of 4307, Village Centre Court, Ste. 100, Mississauga, Ontario, L4Y 1B8, Canada, the Plaintiff claims against the Defendants the following relief:

1. A declaration that the appointment by the First Defendant of the Second Defendant as Trustee of the Tse's Overseas Family Trust No.2 ("The Trust") in place of the First Defendant is void and of no effect;

2. A declaration that the removal of the Plaintiff from the class of beneficiaries of the Trust is void and of no effect, or alternatively an Order that such removal should be set aside and the Plaintiff be reinstated as sole beneficiary;
3. A declaration that any appointment made by the Trustee of the Trust of any beneficiary other than the Plaintiff to the class of beneficiaries is void and of no effect, or alternatively an Order that such appointment should be set aside.
4. A declaration that the change of jurisdiction of the Trust from that of the Cayman Islands to that of the Turks & Caicos Islands is void and of no effect, or alternatively an Order that such change of jurisdiction be set aside and the jurisdiction of the Trust revert to that of the Cayman Islands.
5. A declaration that the change of governing law of the Trust from that of the Cayman Islands to that of the Turks & Caicos Islands is void and of no effect, or alternatively an Order that such change of governing law be set aside and the governing law of the Trust revert to that of the Cayman Islands.
6. An Order that the First Defendant, or, in the alternative to paragraph 1 above, the Second Defendant, be removed as Trustee of the Trust and that a Cayman Islands institutional trustee, approved by the Court, be appointed as sole trustee;
7. Further, or alternatively, an Order for the appointment of some fit and proper person or persons as Receiver of the Trust to have all the powers of the Trustee of the Trust and all such other powers as the Court may think fit, to make such enquiries, investigations, and to take such steps, as the Court may think fit, for the purpose of getting in and preserving the value of the assets of the Trust.
8. The costs of this Summons be paid by the Defendants, to be taxed on the indemnity basis.

If a Defendant does not acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to it as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF
SERVICE OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the Originating Summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the Acknowledgment of Service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Originating Summons*)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of _____" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as _____" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
