

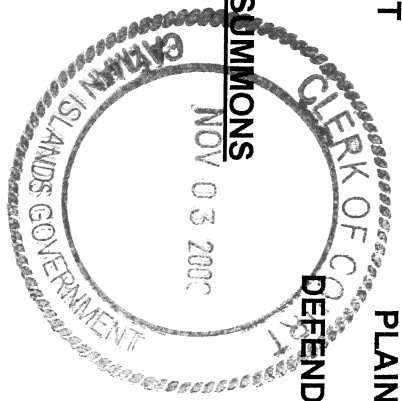

By this Summons, issued on the applicant of MARY J. PARCHMENT of 8A Eldon Street, Savannah, Grand Cayman, the Plaintiff claim against the Defendant for the sale and equitable division of the property Savannah Block 27D Parcel 321AND for the following orders to be made;

1. That the value of the Parties share in the property located at Registration section Savannah Block 27D Parcel 321 be determined by this Honourable Court.
2. That the Plaintiff be at liberty to purchase the Defendant's share of the equity in the property located at Registration section Savannah Block 27D Parcel 321, such purchase to take place within 60 days or such specified time set by this Honourable Court.
3. That failing such as specified in paragraph 2 above, the property should be sold and the net equity be divided between the Parties in such amounts to be determined by this Court.

4. That the valuation report prepared by J.E.C. Property Consultants in July 2008 be accepted as the current valuation on the property.
5. That the Defendant be restrained from damaging, destroying or decreasing the value of the said property or from incurring further encumbrances against the property.
6. Such further or other relief as this Honourable Court deems just.
7. That the Defendant pays the Plaintiff cost of these proceedings.

If the Defendant does acknowledge service, such judgment may be given or order made against or in relation to him as the Court may think just and expedient.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE
OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS**

The accompanying form of acknowledgement of service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an acknowledgement of service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgement of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledgement of service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is used as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
