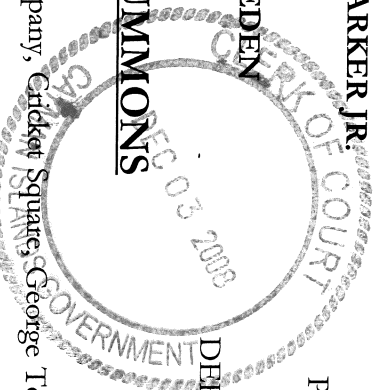

ORIGINATING SUMMONS



LET THE DEFENDANT of Paget Brown Trust Company, ~~Cricket Square~~ George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands attend before the Judge in Chambers, at the Law Courts, George Town, Grand Cayman on the day of 2008, at o'clock on the hearing of an application by the Plaintiff of 132 Fern Circle, George Town, Grand Cayman, Cayman Islands for the following orders:

1. THAT the Plaintiff be appointed as Guardian of the minor child Analeh Keyra Parker (the "Child") pursuant to s.7(1) of the Guardianship and Custody of Children's Law (as Revised);
2. THAT the Plaintiff and the Defendant share joint custody over the Child;
3. THAT the Defendant is to have day to day care and control of the Child and the Plaintiff is to have access to the child as follows:
 - (a) The Plaintiff shall have access to the Child twice a week for overnight visits on such days to be agreed between the Parties;
 - (b) The Plaintiff shall have overnight access to the Child on two weekends a month;
 - (c) The Plaintiff shall have access to the Child on alternate public holidays;

(d) The Plaintiff shall have access to the Child every other mid-term, Christmas and Easter Holidays; and

(e) The Plaintiff shall have access to the Child for one (1) month during the Summer Holidays;

THAT each party bear one half of the medical, dental, optical and educational expenses reasonably and properly incurred in respect of the Child until the child attains the age of 18 or until such time as the Child completes full time education whichever is the later;

5. **THAT** a social inquiry report be prepared in respect of this matter should it be deemed necessary

6. **THAT** there be liberty to apply; and

7. There be no order as to costs.

AND LET THE DEFENDANT within fourteen (14) days after service of this Summons on her, counting the day of service, return the accompanying Acknowledgment of Service to the Courts office.

DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE

OF ORIGINATING SUMMONS


The accompanying form of Acknowledgment of Service should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person. After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495G, George Town, Grand Cayman.

Notes for Guidance

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. If you wish to defend claims made in the originating summons, or intend to attend the proceedings and to participate in them so far as necessary (although not necessarily in an adversarial manner) you should tick the "Yes" box in paragraph 2 of the acknowledgment of service.
3. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
4. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (the name stated on the Originating Summons)".
5. Where the Defendant is a FIRM and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a PARTNER by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
7. Where the Defendant is a LIMITED COMPANY the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on its behalf.
8. Where the Defendant is a MINOR or a MENTAL PATIENT, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian ad litem.
9. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
