

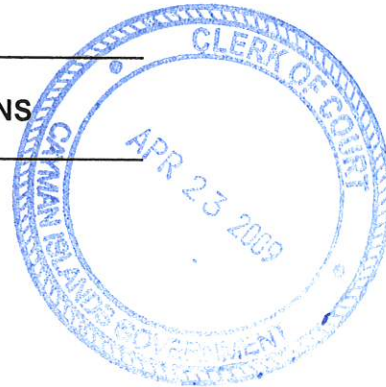

THIS WRIT OF SUMMONS has been issued against you by the above-named Plaintiff in respect of the claim set out on the next page.

Within fourteen (14) days after the service of this Writ on you, counting the day of service, you must either satisfy the claim or return to the Court Office, P.O. Box 495GT, George Town, Grand Cayman, the accompanying Acknowledgement of Service stating whether you intend to contest these proceedings.

If you fail to satisfy the claim or to return the acknowledgement within the time stated, or if you return the acknowledgement without stating therein an intention to contest the proceedings, the Plaintiff may proceed with the action and judgment may be entered against you forthwith without further notice.

NOTE – This Writ may not be served later than 4 calendar months (or, if leave is required to effect service out of the jurisdiction, 6 months) beginning with the date of issue unless renewed by order of the Court.

## STATEMENT OF CLAIM

1. The Plaintiff is the Proprietors, Strata Plan No. 238, a body corporate established pursuant to the Strata Titles Registration Law in respect of the development known as Conch Pointe Beach Resort ("the Development") and comprises the proprietors from time to time of the individual Strata Lots that make up the Development ("the Corporation"). The Defendant is the owner of the Strata Lot known as Unit 9, Conch Pointe Beach Resort, as comprised under block & parcel number West Bay North West 3D 155H9.
2. The Plaintiff is, inter alia, responsible for the insurance, repair, renewal and maintenance of the common parts of the Development. The Plaintiff also arranges the supply of water to the Development. Individual Proprietors are invoiced by the Plaintiff in respect of water supply, maintenance fees and insurance premiums ("the Strata Fees"). Individual Proprietors are responsible for payment to the Plaintiff of the Strata Fees in accordance with the Strata Titles Registration Law (2005 revision) and the Plaintiff's By-Laws.
3. The Defendant has been in substantial arrears in respect of Strata Fees since 30<sup>th</sup> April 2008 and apart from payment of CI\$3,660.04 on 7<sup>th</sup> May 2008 and of CI\$4,395.94 on 9<sup>th</sup> September 2008 has failed to make any further payments towards Strata Fees. The Defendant currently owes the Plaintiff CI\$17,175.68 in unpaid Strata Fees.
4. In accordance with its By-Laws, the Plaintiff claims interest at the rate of 4% per annum over the thirty (30) day London Inter Bank Offer Rate for United States Dollars at the time of default quoted by the banker's of the Corporation with a minimum of 12% per annum, accruing on a daily basis with monthly rests, on all payments due to the Corporation and unpaid for fourteen (14) days after the due date. The Defendant has been in default since 30<sup>th</sup> April 2008.


AND the Plaintiff claims:

1. The sum of CI\$17,175.68.
2. Interest.
3. Costs.

If, within the time for returning the Acknowledgment of Service, the Defendant pays the total amount claimed of CI\$17,175.88, as well as interest and costs further proceedings will be stayed. The money must be paid to the Plaintiff or its Attorney.

## NOTES ON ADDRESS FOR SERVICE

Attorney: where the Defendant is represented by an attorney, state the attorney's place of business in the Cayman Islands. A Defendant may not act by a foreign attorney.

Defendant in person: where the Defendant is acting in person, he must give his post office box number and the physical address of his residence or, if he does not reside in the Cayman Islands, he must give an address in Grand Cayman where communications for him should be sent. In the case of a limited company, "residence" means its registered or principal office.

**DIRECTIONS FOR ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF SERVICE**  
**OF WRIT OF SUMMONS**

1. The accompanying form of *Acknowledgment of Service* should be completed by an Attorney acting on behalf of the Defendant or by the Defendant if acting in person

After completion it must be delivered or sent by post to the Law Courts, P.O. Box 495, George Town, Grand Cayman

2. A Defendant who states in his Acknowledgment of Service that he intends to contest the proceedings *must also serve a defence* on the Attorney for the Plaintiff (or on the Plaintiff if acting in person).

If a Statement of Claim is indorsed on the Writ (i.e. the words "Statement of Claim" appear on the top of page 2), the Defence must be served within 14 days after the time for acknowledging service of the Writ, unless in the meantime a summons for judgment is served on the Defendant.

If the Statement of Claim is not indorsed on the Writ, the Defence need not be served until 14 days after a Statement of Claim has been served on the Defendant

If the Defendant fails to serve his defence within the appropriate time, the Plaintiff may enter judgment against him without further notice.

3. A *Stay of Execution* against the Defendant's goods may be applied for where the Defendant is unable to pay the money for which any judgment is entered. If a Defendant to an action for a debt or liquidated demand (i.e. a fixed sum) who does not intend to contest the proceedings states, in answer to Question 3 in the Acknowledgment of Service, that he intends to apply for a stay, execution will be stayed for 14 days after his Acknowledgment, but he must, within that time, *issue a Summons* for a stay of execution, supported by an affidavit of his means. The affidavit should state any offer which the Defendant desires to make for payment of the money by installments or otherwise.

## NOTES FOR GUIDANCE

1. Each Defendant (if there are more than one) is required to complete an Acknowledgment of Service and return it to the Courts Office.
2. For the purpose of calculating the period of 14 days for acknowledging service, a writ served on the Defendant personally is treated as having been served on the day it was delivered to him.
3. Where the Defendant is sued in a name different from his own, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the words "sued as (*the name stated on the Writ of Summons*)".
4. Where the Defendant is a **FIRM** and an attorney is not instructed, the form must be completed by a **PARTNER** by name, with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "Partner in the firm of (.....)" after his name.
5. Where the Defendant is sued as an individual **TRADING IN A NAME OTHER THAN HIS OWN**, the form must be completed by him with the addition in paragraph 1 of the description "trading as (.....)" after his name.
6. Where the Defendant is a **LIMITED COMPANY** the form must be completed by an Attorney or by someone authorised to act on behalf of the Company, but the Company can take no further step in the proceedings without an Attorney acting on his behalf.
7. Where the Defendant is a **MINOR** or a **MENTAL PATIENT**, the form must be completed by an Attorney acting for a guardian *ad litem*.
8. A Defendant acting in person may obtain help in completing the form at the Courts Office.
